Christ the King Parish Pastoral Council Meeting Minutes March 4, 2024

<u>Call to Order-</u> Meeting called to order at 6:30 pm by Father Johnathan Schmolt.

Prayer-Father Johnathan Schmolt led the Council in prayer.

Roll Call-Father Johnathan Schmolt, Jim Rice, Mary Ann Hockman, Tim Slifko, Floyd Hauth, Ed Vancas Deacon Gene Miller-Exofficio, Tina Stine, Robert Chirdon and Jenny Leskovansky. Excused Absence: Krist Twoey-President. Guest: Dallas Kephart **Special Guest**-Dallas Kephart presented information to Council regarding potential Grant available for CTK Parish Center. Discussion was held and Jenny agreed to review information and reach out to local municipalities as necessary for application for grant. Dallas noted if the Parish applies for the grant to inform his office so they can provide letter of support.

Approval of Minutes

Minutes for February 5, 2024, meeting was reviewed, motion to accept minutes with recommendation to change minutes procedure. Minutes will be emailed to Council Members for review and approval and after 1 week submit approved minutes to church secretary for inclusion in bulletin made by Mary Ann, second by Floyd, vote taken, and minutes approved with new approval procedure without opposition.

Old Business:

Stained Glass Windows-Robert reported he and Kristi will be working on this project.

<u>Religious Education Report-</u>No formal report given, it was noted Confirmation will be held Tuesday, March 12, 2024, at 7 pm with 11 students from Christ the King Parish and 32 students total and First Communion will be held Sunday, May 5, 2024. <u>Committee Reports:</u>

Fundraising Committee-Jenny reported the 21 Club cycle from April 2023 to October 2023 had a net profit of \$12,516.17 with 1065 tickets sold. The current 21 Club cycle has 1082 tickets sold; she noted more sellers are always welcome as there are a total of 1250 tickets available for sale. Jenny reported the Turkey Bingo had a net profit of \$6,317.82. The Paddle Party was held this past weekend, no report at this time. Jenny thanked all parishioners for their generous support and donations.

<u>Cemetery Committee</u>-Robert reported no report at this time.

<u>Building and Grounds Committee</u>-Jenny reported floor issue in CTK church center aisle is to be evaluated by mason. The CTK Parish Center furnace was malfunctioning, the filter was cleaned, and a circulating pump replaced. CTK Parish Center ice machine is not repairable and will need to be replaced. The Finance Committee will be evaluating the purchase of a new ice machine. The relic from the previous CTK altar was located by Father Johnathan and has been placed under the current altar. Father is awaiting response from SCI Houtzdale regarding strip and wax of CTK Parish Center floors. Jack Archer has agreed to have our waxing equipment evaluated for maintenance.

Evangelization Committee- Deacon reported the Traveling Chalice program has been well supported and he thanked those who are participating in the program. RCIA program had started with 1 participant and now has a child and another adult joining while a few others have expressed interest in the program. Deacon and Father are working together on the remaining curriculum. Next Evangelization Committee meeting will be held Thursday, March 14, 2024. Father reported the National Eucharistic Congress will be held in Indianapolis, IN in July 2024. Father will keep parishioners updated on our church activities related to National Congress.

New Business-

<u>Cemetery Plot Fees</u>-It was noted there are currently 20 plots left in St. Lawrence cemetery along the tree line opposite the main road. It was noted that additional plots have been surveyed and outlined in St. Lawrence to the right of the dirt road in the cemetery. Father noted for clarification St. Lawrence Cemetery will be expanding in the area already owned by the parish. The Council reviewed current fees for parish cemeteries. Current fees:

St. Lawrence (Houtzdale), Calvary Cemetery (Madera) Cost: \$800 per grave, includes perpetual care Vault opening & Maintenance Fee: \$700 Cremation opening & Maintenance Fee: \$300 Immaculate Conception (Osceola Mills), St. Joseph (Osceola Mills) Cost: \$450 per grave, includes perpetual care Vault opening & Maintenance Fee: \$850 Cremation opening & Maintenance Fee: \$400

Discussion held regarding current fees. Motion made to review fees in 12 months to determine if changes are necessary at that time, motion made by Tina, seconded by Ed, motion passed without opposition.

Immaculate Conception Plaster-Father reported he has received a bid of \$11,500.00 to repair the plaster in sanctuary of Immaculate Conception. Discussion was held regarding possible roof leaks, after discussion it was decided that prior to voting on having plaster repaired further evaluation of roof should be done to ensure all necessary repairs have been completed. The issue will be directed to Building and Grounds for further review of possible roof issues...

Pastoral Council minutes continued...

Parish Membership-Father reported that currently the official membership is 537 families, however after the Christmas cards that were sent out with cards for return of parishioner contact information, only approximately 150 cards were returned. Father noted he would like to see the Council reaching out to the parishioners who have not been connected to the parish over a period of time. Further discussion on how best to contact those parishioners will be held at future meetings.

Parish Directory-Father presented information regarding a vendor who would provide a Parish directory. Further discussion will be held at the future meetings.

<u>Next Meeting</u>-Discussion held regarding timing for next meeting, there will not be a meeting in April, the next meeting will be held in May.

Next meeting set for Monday, May 6, 2024, at 6:30 pm

<u>Adjournment</u>-Ed made motion, second by Robert to adjourn meeting, vote taken, motion passed without opposition. Meeting adjourned at 7:50 pm
