Ash Wednesday

Wednesday, February 14 • 8:30am & 6:30pm

This year, Ash Wednesday will be celebrated on Wednesday, February 14. Masses will be at 8:30am at Immaculate Conception and at 6:30pm at Christ the King. Ash Wednesday is a day of abstinence and fasting for those aged 18-58, which means you should refrain from eating meat and only eat one full meal with two smaller meals to sustain your body's needs during the day; eating between meals is not permitted, however liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. The law of fasting is not required when your health or work are seriously affected. Although Ash Wednesday coincides with Valentine's Day this year, Ash Wednesday supersedes Valentine's Day. Father Johnathan recommends that any traditional observances that would occur on Valentine's Day be transferred to another day.

To prevent your child from grooming behavior, teach them about healthy relationships, how to stay safe online, and who are the trusted adults they can go to for help. NOTICE – LENTEN PRACTICES 2024

The season of Lent begins this year on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024, and concludes when the Paschal Triduum of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord begins at the start of the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, March 28, 2024.

The following practices and regulations are promulgated and binding for all Latin Rite Catholics in the Diocese of Erie for Lent and the Paschal Triduum, 2024. Eastern Rite Catholics who may be attending Latin Rite parishes have their own proper regulations and should consult their own eparchy or parish.

- 1. Traditional Lenten practices of **PRAYER**, **FASTING**, and **ALSMGIVING**, and other forms of self-denial, are recommended most warmly by the Church. Daily Mass is particularly encouraged.
- 2. **ASH WEDNESDAY, ALL FRIDAYS IN LENT,** and **GOOD FRIDAY** are days of **abstinence** from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older.
- 3. In 2024, St. Patrick's Day (March 17 Principal Patronal Feast Day of the Diocese of Erie) falls on the Fifth Sunday of Lent. In recognition of the importance of this day for the faithful, Bishop Persico has directed that St. Patrick be liturgically observed (at daily Mass, Divine Office, etc.) throughout the diocese on Monday, March 18, 2024.
- 4. **ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY** are also days of <u>fasting</u> for those ages 18 to 58 inclusive. (On these days, those bound by the law of fasting may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. When health or work is seriously affected, the law does not oblige.)
- 5. On **HOLY THURSDAY**, no celebration of the Mass is to begin anywhere in the diocese earlier than 4:30 pm without the explicit approval of Bishop Persico.
- 6. Although it does not include the Liturgy of the Eucharist, by its very nature the **GOOD FRIDAY** service is celebrated by a priest only.
- 7. All celebrations of the **EASTER VIGIL** are to begin *after nightfall* (which is defined as approximately one hour after local sunset.) Nightfall is about 8:45 pm this year. To balance pastoral need and liturgical prescriptions, Bishop Persico has decreed that the Easter Vigil in the Diocese of Erie is to begin at 8:30 pm or any later time. Any start time earlier than 8:30 pm must receive explicit approval from the Bishop.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u>: Minutes for January 8, 2024, meeting was reviewed, motion to accept minutes made by Tim, second by Floyd, vote taken, and minutes approved without opposition.

Old Business

- **Stained Glass Windows:** Kristi reported she and Robert will be examining the windows this week, will provide report at next meeting.
- **Pastoral Council Bylaws**: Bylaws were reviewed, and second vote taken to adopt Bylaws, motion made by Mary Ann, second by Ed, vote taken and motion passed without opposition.

<u>Religious Education Report:</u> Kristi reported no formal report for this meeting, it was noted First Reconciliation will be Thursday, February 15, 2024 with 3 children from our parish and Altar Rosary Society will be hosting a reception for the children and their families after in the Parish Center. It was further noted, Confirmation will be held Tuesday, March 12, 2024 and First Communion will be held Sunday, May 5, 2024.

Committee Reports

- **Fundraising Committee**: Jenny noted the last Fundraising Committee meeting was cancelled due to weather, it was noted the Paddle Party is scheduled on Saturday, March 2, 2024 and donations of gift baskets, new items or gift cards are being accepted and sign up sheets for volunteers are in the back of church.
- **Cemetery Committee**: Kristi reported no report at this time.
- Building and Grounds Committee: Jenny reported CTK kitchen drains have been repaired, IC roof leak and choir loft leak have been repaired. Father had presented quotes from electrician to repair and evaluate needs of CTK church, rectory and parish center. The quote was broken into 3 tasks, task 1 was issues within the rectory that needed addressed and those tasks were authorized by Father and already have been completed. Task 2 included updating lighting fixtures in Parish Center to LED and Task 3 included replacing emergency lighting in Parish Center and church, this quote was voted on and approved to send to Finance Committee for their determination. Father is in the process of obtaining workers from SCI Houtzdale to strip and wax Parish Center floors, awaiting response from SCI Houtzdale.
- Evangelization Committee: Father reported that the Committee has begun sign-ups for the Traveling Chalice program and so far, has 6 families that are interested in participating, the program will begin during Lent and Father noted that more families are encouraged to join this program. Father reported that Stations of the Cross during Lent will be held Fridays, alternating between Immaculate Conception and Christ the King, schedule will be in the bulletin. He further noted from 6:30-7:00 there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament with quiet prayer time and the potential for confession then at 7:00 Stations of the Cross followed by Benediction.
- Easter week schedule will be as follows:

Holy Thursday: 7 pm Christ the King,

Good Friday: 3 pm Immaculate Conception, 7 pm Stations of the Cross Christ the King,

Saturday: 12 noon Blessing of baskets Christ the King,

9 pm Easter Vigil Christ the King

Easter Sunday: 8:30 Mass Immaculate Conception, 10:00 Mass Christ the King

New Business

- **Cemetery Plot Fees:** Father reported that currently cemetery plots at Christ the King cemeteries are \$800 while at Immaculate Conception cemeteries plots are \$250. Discussion held and issue tabled to next meeting for further discussion.
- **Budget**: Father noted budget was recently passed by Finance Committee.
- **CSA**: Father reported 2024 CSA appeal began last week, letters were sent to parishioners. He noted the projects identified for the use of funds that are in excess of Diocesan set Parish goal will be used for Immaculate Conception repair of plaster and painting of sanctuary and Christ the King repair of roof.

Adjournment: Ed made motion, second by Tim to adjourn meeting, vote taken, motion passed without opposition. Meeting adjourned at 7:30 pm


