# Christ the King Parish Pastoral Council Meeting Minutes

### March 31, 2025

Call to Order- Meeting called to order at 6:30 pm by Council President Floyd Hauth.

**Prayer**-Father Johnathan Schmolt led the Council in prayer.

<u>Roll Call</u>-Father Johnathan Schmolt, Floyd Hauth, Tina Stine, Jim Rice, Pauline Raab, Ed Vancas, Mary Ann Hockman, Jenny Leskovansky, Paul Kitko, Deacon Gene Miller, and Tim Slifko

### **Old Business:**

- <u>CTK Church and Rectory Roof Replacement</u>-Father Johnathan reported roofers are ordering supplies and estimate roof installation by the end of April or early May depending on the weather.
- <u>IC Madera Statue Move</u>-Paul reported estimate the move of Marian Shrine from former Immaculate Conception site in Madera to Immaculate Conception Cemetery in Madera is the end of April or early May depending on the weather.
- Religious Education Report-Father Johnathan reported Confirmation was held Sunday, March 23, 2025. The last day of classes for Religious Education will be Palm Sunday and there is a Seder Meal scheduled for the students that day.

#### **Committee Reports:**

- Fundraising Committee- Jenny reported Net profit for 21 Club was \$10, 363.34, Net profit for Turkey Bingo was \$6,189.49. Net profit for Paddle Party was \$4,994.78. Net profit for Lenten Fish Dinner on Friday March 14, 2025 was \$971.32 and 192 dinners were sold Big Cash Raffle Tickets are for sale, \$100 a ticket with grand prize of \$10,000 and 5 \$500 winners as well. Winning ticket will be drawn at Patriot Day Festival. Tickets are available from Cindy Slifko for anyone who is interested in being a seller. Ham Bingo April 5, 2025. Next 21 Club Dinner Saturday, April 26, 2025 and Patriot Day Festival, Sunday, September 7, 2025. All of the Fundraising events are in need of volunteers please volunteer as able.
- Cemetery Committee-Father Johnathan reported there were a handful of phone calls to the rectory related to recent changes in cemetery prices and policies. New Policies and prices went into effect March 1, 2025. Curry and Associates Surveying are working on marking off graves at St Joseph Cemetery in Osceola and at IC Cemetery in Madera and correcting mapping subsequent to placement of Marian Shrine at IC Cemetery. Areas of weeds in top portion of St Lawerence, part of Sacred Heart Cemetery and before the hillside of St Barbara's Cemetery are going to be addressed with weed killer to promote better grass growth.
- <u>Building and Grounds Committee</u>-Jenny reported Committee is going to install smoke detectors and CO2 monitors in CTK and IC buildings. The committee is working on possible repair for dishwasher in CTK parish center. Father Johnathan reported Lightning Electric will be replacing lights in main hall of CTK Parish Center with LED light panels as well as replacing Emergency lighting.

<u>Evangelization Committee</u>-Deacon Gene reported turnout for Mike Lucas program, Bible Study and Stations of the Cross has been good. There is 1 candidate for RCIA. Womens 1:38 Retreat will be live streamed in the CTK Parish Center Saturday, April 5, 2025, retreat starts at 9 am and will run until 11 am. Divine Mercy Sunday is Sunday, April 27, 2025 there will be a program at 3 pm.

### **New Business-**

- <u>Secretary</u>-Father Johnathan reported that Ali Jacoby has submitted her resignation from position of Parish Secretary effective May 1, 2025. Ali has been with the Parish for 15 years and will be greatly missed. Ali has noted she is willing to train a replacement when one becomes available. Discussion was held regarding office hours, after discussion it was suggested that at the time of transition to a new secretary office hours could be changed. Motion made by Pauline, second by Ed to transition Parish Office hours to Mon-Fri 9 am to 1 pm, with possible changes as necessary. Vote taken, motion passed without opposition. Father Johnathan reported he would like to see some portions of Secretary job transition to another staff member as there are a lot of responsibilities for that position. Father noted he will advertise for the replacement secretary with goal of replacement as soon as possible.
- New Staff Position—Discussion was held regarding the potential need for an additional position within the parish. Father Johnathan noted that a goal of our Parish is to spread God's word and bring others back to the Catholic faith if they have been away and into the Catholic faith if they are new to the faith. Discussion was held regarding the potential position of an Outreach Director who would be in charge of communicating Parish events and promotion of the Catholic faith. It was noted this role could assume the responsibility of creating and publishing the weekly bulletin and communicate parish events using various methods of communication. A job description was reviewed and discussed. After discussion, motion was made by Tim, second by Pauline to send recommendation of hiring a full time Outreach Director to the Finance Committee, vote taken, motion passed without opposition. Father Johnathan will take recommendation to Finance Committee.

Next meeting set for Monday, May 5, 2025, at 6:30 pm

<u>Adjournment</u>-Tina made motion, second by Ed to adjourn meeting, vote taken, motion passed without opposition. Meeting adjourned at 7:45 pm


### LIVING THE MISSION


