Ash Wednesday

Wednesday, February 14 • 8:30am & 6:30pm

This year, Ash Wednesday will be celebrated on Wednesday, February 14. Masses will be at 8:30am at Immaculate Conception and at 6:30pm at Christ the King. Ash Wednesday is a day of abstinence and fasting for those aged 18-58, which means you should refrain from eating meat and only eat one full meal with two smaller meals to sustain your body's needs during the day; eating between meals is not permitted, however liquids including milk and fruit juices are allowed. The law of fasting is not required when your health or work are seriously affected. Although Ash Wednesday coincides with Valentine's Day this year, Ash Wednesday supersedes Valentine's Day. Father Johnathan recommends that any traditional observances that would occur on Valentine's Day be transferred to another day.

In Discipleship

"The energy and passion of over 400 students coming together was palpable," reflected Deacon Steve Washek, director of Faith Formation for the Diocese of Erie.

The diocesan-wide day-long confirmation retreat, a new initiative by the Office of Faith Formation, brought together students preparing for confirmation from across the region. Deacon Washek continued: "This retreat was a unique opportunity to help discover God and the offerings of faith for those who follow Him." Moments of adoration and confession became transformative experiences for many. As the event culminated with a Mass offered by Bishop Lawrence Persico, the magnitude of its impact on the spiritual growth of the youth was evident.
