February 13, 2024

<u>21 Club</u>-Cindy reported net profit from October 2023 21 Club was \$12,516.17. She noted that rotation had 1065 tickets sold. So far for the April 2024 21 Club there have been 1082 tickets sold. There are a total of 1250 tickets available each rotation and Cindy encouraged if we could get another seller or two that would help the net profit. It was decided for the April party there will be a regular 50/50. The menu for the April dinner will be discussed at the next meeting. Letters with rsvp for April party will be stuffed at next Fundraising meeting.

Turkey Bingo-Cindy reported the net profit from Turkey Bingo was \$6,317.82, it was noted that is approximately \$200 increase from previous Turkey Bingo.
