Christ the King Parish Pastoral Council (Comprised of Christ the King Church and Immaculate Conception Church) Meeting Minutes November 13, 2023

<u>Call to Order</u>- Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by President Kristi Twoey.

Prayer-Father Johnathan Schmolt led the Council in prayer.

Roll Call-Father Johnathan Schmolt, Krist Twoey-President, Deacon Gene Miller-Ex-officio, Robert Chirdon, Jim Rice, Mary Ann Hockman, Tina Stine, Tim Slifko, Floyd Hauth, Ed Vancas and Jenny Leskovansky

Approval of Minutes

Minutes for October 2, 2023, meeting was reviewed, motion to accept minutes made by Robert, second by Ed, vote taken, and minutes approved without opposition.

Old Business:

<u>Stained Glass Windows</u>-Kristi reported she has spoken with Associated Crafts and is still awaiting information from them, she noted it was suggested one of the crates containing the windows be opened to determine the status of the window, council agreed with this idea. Kristi will report back to the council at the next meeting.

<u>Pastoral Council Bylaws</u>-Bylaws were reviewed, changes made related to Parish name after recently announced merger, membership eligibility and typographical errors were noted, all changes will be made, and Council will review and vote on Bylaws at next meeting.

<u>Pastoral Council Membership Application</u>-Application was reviewed, and changes made related to parish name, and requirement for council member to be active church participant. Motion made by Robert, second by Jenny to accept Pastoral Council Membership Application with corrections noted, vote taken, motion passed without opposition.

<u>Immaculate Conception Hall Rental Agreement</u>-Mary Ann presented Immaculate Conception Hall Rental Agreement, discussion was held, after discussion it was suggested to make addition of 'nothing may be attached to walls or ceiling.' Motion made to accept Hall Rental Agreement with addition noted by Mary Ann, second by Jim, vote taken, and motion approved without opposition.

<u>Weber, Murphy, Fox Facility Assessment CTK Church</u> facilities-Discussion was held regarding necessity for assessment, motion made by Robert, second by Mary Ann to recommend acceptance of Weber, Murphy Fox for facility assessment to Finance Committee, vote taken, Floyd and Jim voted in opposition, Tim abstained, motioned passed.

Committee Reports:

<u>Fundraising Committee</u>-Jenny reported Patriot Day Festival Net Profit report has been compiled and net profit from Patriot Day Festival is \$20,242.39. Jenny reported Turkey Bingo is scheduled for Saturday, November 18, 2023. Volunteers are still needed to work on the floor and kitchen.

<u>Cemetery Committee</u>-Father reported markers have been placed at St. Lawerence Cemetery. Father also noted Cemetery committee will be combined, Robert stated he will reach out to an Immaculate Conception member who has been active with their cemetery committee to ask him to join the combined committee.

<u>Building and Grounds Committee</u>-Jenny reported the Building and Grounds Committee will now be combined into one committee for both churches. Jenny reported CTK facility project list includes: steamers, garbage disposal replacement, glass entry door sticking, loose article in center aisle, and multiple other items, the committee reviewed the list and is working on items. Jim R reported IC facility recently had flue, chimney, garage wall cracks and retaining wall repairs. Jim R also reported the parish hall dishwasher is to be installed this week and there are two areas on the church that require attention an area of flashing that is loose and an area of rubber roofing that required repair, both are going to be assessed. Jim R also noted the bilco door to the basement will need replacement in the spring.

<u>Evangelization Committee</u>-Deacon the first meeting of the Evangelization Committee. Posters for Eucharistic Revival have been placed in Christ the King and Immaculate Conception. Plans are in the works for Adoration and Stations of the Cross on Tuesday, November 28 at Christ the King and Adoration and the Rosary on Monday, December 11 at Immaculate Conception. Deacon reported RCIA classes are going well, there is one candidate for Confirmation, a family that wishes to join the church and a few current parishioners who are also attending the program.

New Business-

<u>Land for sale new St. Lawerence Cemetery</u>-Discussion was held regarding parcel of land for sale near St. Lawerence Cemetery, after discussion held, motion made by Tim, second by Robert to recommend Father Johnathan investigate potential for purchase of land, vote taken and motion passed without opposition.

<u>CTK Annual Facility Maintenance Agreement</u>-Bids were reviewed regarding annual facility maintenance agreement for CTK facilities, after discussion held, motion made by Floyd, second by Robert to recommend second bid reviewed to Finance Committee, vote taken and motion passed without opposition.

<u>CTK Rectory HVAC</u>-Father Johnathan reviewed bids received thus far for repair or replacement of CTK Rectory HVAC system, after discussion it was noted, he is still awaiting one more bid and issue tabled to next meeting while awaiting additional bid.

Christ the King-Immaculate Conception Merger-Father reviewed Decree by Bishop Persico announcing merger of Christ the King Church and Immaculate Conception Church effective December 1, 2023. Father noted mass times will not change. Father further noted final decisions regarding how finances of churches will be merged will be discussed by the Finance Committee and determined at a later date.

Immaculate Conception Bazaar-Mary Ann thanked all parishioners from both churches for their support of the Immaculate Conception Altar Rosary Society Roast Beef Dinner and Bazaar. She reported the net profit for the event was \$8,298, which is almost double their previ-

ous best net profit. She noted they were so busy they ran out of food and hoped to grow the event next year.

Old Business

<u>CTK Kitchen Drains</u>-Father said Bloom has not cleared drains yet.

<u>CTK Parish Center Kitchen Steamers</u>-Tony will look at steamers to see if removal is an option to allow for rearranging kitchen to make it more functional.

<u>CTK Parish Center Garbage Disposal</u>-Discussion was held regarding potential repair of garbage disposal, per Bloom it is not repairable and will need replaced, Jim L. and Tony agreed to investigate getting a new one.

<u>CTK Facility Project List-</u>List reviewed, and multiple projects were discussed, and members of committee agreed to address projects. <u>IC Chimney & Flue-</u>Jim R. reported Paul Demko was at IC and repair work was done on church flue, rectory chimney, garage and retaining wall.

IC Parish Hall-Jim R reported new dishwasher to be installed this week in the parish hall.

<u>IC Grounds</u>-Jim R reported the use of high lift for chimney repairs caused disruption of grass and that area has been repaired and reseeded.

<u>IC Church Roof</u>-Jim R reported there is an area of church roof that needs flashing sealed and another area that may require repair of rubber roofing.

IC Church Bilco Door-Jim R reported the bilco door to the church basement is in poor condition and will need replaced in the spring.

New Business

CTK Parish Center-Jack reported ice machine is getting repaired and will be placed on a preventive maintenance schedule.

Discussion was held regarding scheduling of meetings, it was decided to move meetings to 2nd Sunday of Month and skip December, next meeting will be 2nd Sunday in January.
