Dear Parishioners,

In just a few days we will celebrate the Solemnity of the Nativity better known as Christmas. On this day we commemorate the birth of Jesus, the incarnation, God has come to us. I hope everyone has a wonderful celebration with your family and friends.

As we look at the creche and Jesus lying in a manger we are reminded of just how ordinary His birth was. Just a baby, Jesus had his full human life ahead of him while having been the Word for all of eternity. Mary, like many of us, is challenged for being away from home while giving birth yet that moment becomes the greatest gift for all of human history and the reason why any visions of the Blessed Mother that have occurred are so treasured today. Joseph, like many people, has an experience of an unexpected pregnancy and caring for a new mother and wife, and yet he fully accepts and fulfills his contribution to salvation history. The scene of the creche, an ordinary event with eternal ramifications. Please take a moment this Christmas season to contemplate this marvel of history and eternity.

Changing gears, these last few months at Christ the King Parish have been quite eventful. The sale of the Immaculate Conception Madera church property has been completed to the Houtzdale Municipal Authority. The Marian shrine that is on the property will be moved to the Immaculate Conception Madera Cemetery by July. This is one project that I believe will come to an amenable conclusion.

The one hundredth anniversary of the building of Immaculate Conception Church in Osceola Mills was commemorated on December 9, 2024 with the celebration of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. The mass and subsequent banquet were very lovely. The Altar Rosary society, through Connie the president, created a wonderful display of the history of the Immaculate Conception, Osceola Mills parish. Thank you for everyone's participation and work to make the evening a special event.

The evangelization committee, led by Deacon Gene, has been working on bringing more faith experiences to the people of our parish. On December 7 the committee hosted the St. Nicholas party for our children. This event brought to the children an experience of Christian cheer along with the story of the generous bishop St. Nicholas.

In 2025 the committee is planning on a Lenten presentation on reading icons. We are scheduling Fr. Larry Richards to come during the late summer to give an evening talk. Next September we are planning on holding a parish retreat guided by a national speaker.

We are still working on ways to reach out to the boroder community to introduce people to our Catholic faith. We currently have two adults preparing to join the Catholic Church and we are continually open for any references for people who want to learn more about our faith.

Religious Education, led by Cassandra Kitko, has been going well for the first half of the school year. We have fifty four children from first through ninth grade learning each week about their faith. I appreciate our catechists and the time they devote to being witnesses of the faith for the children. We continue to need more people involved in working with our children. The need today is mentors for our teens and people praying for their well being. After worshiping God in mass, the next most important action as a Roman Catholic Church is to teach our faith to the next generation. The more help we can have in this area the more fruitful our witness will be.

Our Knights of Columbus council here at Christ the King have been busy hosting their various fundraising events. On December 31, New Years Eve they will hold their Elimino event. Monthly they host bingo at Christ the King. These and other fundraising events become the financial support that they are able to provide to various community organizations and our parish. I am grateful for all the charity work they do for the parish and community.

The Knight of Columbus council at Osceola Mills have continued to provide material support for the Immaculate Conception Church building and events. I am grateful for their help.

The Altar Rosary Society is one organization for the entire parish. Beyond their help they provided for the Immaculate Conception 100th Anniversary banquet, they are quietly working in the background at almost every event with a meal or snacks to share. They provided crafts for the children for St. Nicholas day. During the winter they host a monthly community luncheon in the Immaculate Conception social hall. It is a free meal for anyone in the community. The Altar Rosary provides refreshments for events like First Communion or to honor a feast day. Thank you Altar Rosary for everything you do to help out at our parish.

Our fundraising committee puts in multiple hours of work to raise funds for our parish. In particular they strive to bring in enough funds to cover the cost of operating the Parish Center. Whether it is the Patriot Day festival, the Paddle Party, Turkey Bingo, 21 Club, or other events they are a dedicated group of volunteers that helps relieve some

of the financial burden for our parish. I thank them for all their hard work along with the many people that participated in running the events.

There are numerous other parishioners who on their own initiative give their time to help make our parish function well. Whether they help with money counting, setting up for mass as a sacristan, assisting as an Altar Server, being an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, proclaiming the word as a Lector, caring for the church grounds, serving on one of our councils and committees, or any other way, thank you for your service.

In the end we do all this volunteer work because we want to give praise and glory to God almighty. We exist, our mission, our purpose is to worship and honor our Lord Jesus Christ in the Roman Catholic Tradition. We rely on the Holy Spirit to guide our actions in order to follow the will of God, our Father. While the practical necessities of buildings, finances, and even the compassionate work of charity can occupy our attention, as a parish we need to bring our focus back on our core purpose for existing - Jesus Christ who is honored and adored in our personal and communal prayer and received in his glorious gift of the Eucharist. That little baby born years ago is the reason we do what we do.

As we enter into the jubilee of 2025 with the theme "Pilgrims of Hope" may we eagerly respond to the call of the Holy Spirit.

For myself, I hear the need for practical hands-on help to bring the faith to our community. I hear the call to be more engaged in communicating with the community. This means needing professional help in marketing to promote our faith. I hear the call for me to be more devoted to teaching the faith. This means having a facilities manager to oversee the maintenance around our campuses to free up my time. I hear the call of the Holy Spirit to have some full time people on staff - lay or religious - to help me reach the adults in our area with the faith. All of these items need the people and finances to make them happen. If I am hearing the call of the Holy Spirit correctly, then I trust that the Holy Spirit will provide the means to carry His message to Houtzdale, Osceola Mills, and beyond.

The Year of Jubilee has a special logo or picture (see front) that represents something. The Jubilee logo has distinct colors and meaning: Red symbolizes love, passion and self-sacrifice, Christ's sacrifice and his boundless love for humanity; Orange expresses joy, vitality, and enthusiasm, the light that illuminates the path of faith; Green is universally recognized as the color of hope, growth, and rebirth, and; Blue symbolizes faith, peace, and tranquility, evoking the sky and spirituality, and inviting contemplation and prayer.
