# Pastoral Council Special Meeting Minutes

### Monday, July 22, 2024

**Pastoral Council Members Present:** Father Johnathan Schmolt, Tina Stine, Mary Ann Hockman, Jim Rice, Ed Vancas, Floyd Hauth, and Jenny Leskovansky. Absent: Tim Slifko and Deacon Gene Miller.

Call to order: Father Johnathan Schmolt called meeting to order at 6:32 pm.

Opening Prayer: Father Johnathan Schmolt opened the meeting with prayer.

**Opening Statement:** Jenny Leskovansky read the opening statement: "Good evening, welcome to the Special Pastoral Council Meeting regarding the Immaculate Conception of Madera Statue. A brief history of the issue prior to the meeting is that upon the closing and deconstruction of Immaculate Conception Church in Madera the statues of The Blessed Mother and Bernadette remained on the property.

"Approximately 1 year ago Pastoral Council and Building and Grounds committee were approached about the possibility of moving the statues. At that time and in subsequent meetings it was noted there were concerns regarding the isolation of the statues and potential for vandalism.

"Earlier this summer a plan was established, reviewed and agreed upon by Pastoral Council to proceed with transitioning the Statues to the Christ the King Parish Center grounds. Upon initiation of this move it came to light that previously alleged isolation and vandalism of the Statues was not occurring. At that time Father Johnathan Schmolt reached out to those responsible for the planned relocation and instructed them to cease the relocation.

"To better determine the best course of action relating to The Blessed Mother and Bernadette Statues, this meeting was called

The goal of this meeting is to obtain opinions from our parish family regarding 1. The potential sale of Immaculate Conception of Madera Church Property and 2. The best way to respect the historical significance of Immaculate Conception in Madera and The Blessed Mother and Bernadette Statues with potential relocation.

"Please note we are a parish family and disrespectful comments will not be tolerated during the open comments period. Each person who wishes to speak will be granted 5 minutes to speak. Please be concise as we are unable to grant extra time in order to ensure all can present their opinions. Please be courteous to all speakers and refrain from comments or questions when others are speaking. Questions will be taken at the end of the comment period during the question-and-answer period."

**Emailed statements:** Jenny then reviewed two emails Father Johnathan has received from parishioners who were unable to attend tonight's meeting.

- Flora Smith sent an email to Father Johnathan noting she prefer the statues at IC Madera not to be moved, but if they must be moved she feels they should be moved to IC Cemetery in Madera.
- Carol Fundanish sent an email to Father Johnathan noting she prefer the statues at IC Madera were not moved, but if they must be moved, she feels they should be moved to IC Cemetery in Madera.

Function of Pastoral Council: Father Johnathan spoke to the group regarding the function of Pastoral Council, he explained that the role of Pastoral Council is to advise the Pastor regarding decisions related to the Parish. He further explained the ultimate decisions regarding the Parish are at his discretion and ultimately, he makes the final decisions. Father further explained that he has been approached about the potential to purchase or lease the property where the statues are located. While no firm details for a potential purchase or lease have been discussed Father did have the property assessed and reported that the assessment found a fair market value of \$22,000.

Open floor for comments: Jenny opened the floor to comments from those in attendance.

- Rob Yebernetsky spoke and noted he would like the statue moved to CTK Parish Center grounds in memory of deceased members and to sell the former IC property if the former IC members agree with a sale.
- Jim Rice spoke and noted he believes the statue should be brought to the CTK Parish Center grounds.
- Mary Ann Hockman spoke and noted she believes the statues should be moved to IC Cemetery.
- Joyce Greslick spoke and noted she believes the decision should be made by former IC members and would support moving it to IC Cemetery.

# Pastoral Council Special Meeting Minutes cont'd

- Kristi Twoey spoke and noted she believes the decision should be made by former IC members and would support moving it to IC Cemetery.
- Rick Kasubick spoke and noted he believes the statues should stay at the former IC Church property and the land should be leased to the potential lessee.
- Tina Stine spoke, she reported she has heard the potential purchaser would consider buying the land and leasing the area of the statues to the Parish and they would maintain the land.
- Virginia Kitko spoke and said her first choice is the statues stay at the current site but if they must be moved, they should be moved to IC Cemetery.
- Rod Kitko spoke and said his first choice is the statues stay at the current site but if they must be moved, they should be moved to IC Cemetery.
- Paul Kitko spoke and said his first choice is for the statues stay at the current site but if they must be moved, they should be moved to IC Cemetery.

**Q&A:** Comments period closed, Jenny instructed the group that the Question-and-Answer period is open to ask questions regarding the statues and suggestions.

- Theresa Spewock asked the size of the property, it was noted there are two parcels, one is 0.95 acres and the second is 0.38 acres, the assessment value of \$22,000 is for both parcels. It was further noted that the statues are on the 0.95-acre parcel. Theresa also inquired if there had been discussions with potential purchaser regarding if damage would occur to the statues related to property maintenance is the purchaser who would lease the land to the church willing to assume maintenance and repair of the statues? Father Johnathan noted discussion has not occurred as yet regarding matters such as these and any agreement entered into would include terms and conditions.
- Father Johnathan noted he has discussed with the potential purchaser the potential to lease a small portion of the land to the church in order to maintain the statues on the site and they are in agreement that this would be agreeable to them and parishioners accessing the statues would not be an issue.
- Tina Stine reported she has heard the potential purchaser would only require a 10 foot by 10 foot fenced in area to meet the needs they have for the site, the remainder of the ground would remain as is presently.
- Rod Kitko asked if there is a written proposal from the purchaser, would the Parish be willing to note a clause in the sale whereby the purchaser abandon the property the purchaser pays to move the statues to IC Cemetery.
- Father Johnathan suggested he would prefer we maintain ownership of the property and lease a small parcel of the land.
- Father Johnathan did note that should the Parish take the route of maintaining the statue at it's present site it is very likely that in 20 years the Parish may be facing the same situation as we are at present.
- Jim Rice spoke and said after the discussion he now feels the statue should remain at IC Church property site.
- Rusty Christoff spoke and suggested selling the property, and leasing the statue sites from the purchaser and place a plaque indicating historical significance of IC Church.
- Paul Kitko inquired of Father Johnathan if a mass could be said at the site if the statues stay at IC Church, Father Johnathan reported while Mass may not be an option, saying the Rosary would be suggested.
- Jenny Leskovansky asked if those who are in favor of keeping the statues on the former IC Church site would be comfortable with a lessee fencing off a 10 foot by 10-foot section of the land? It was agreed this should not be a deterrent to visiting the statues.
- Rusty Christoff suggested asking the potential purchaser and/or lessee to draw up a plan of what exactly they would plan for the site prior to a decision.
- Father Johnathan reported he is uncertain of the exact cost of moving the statues.
- Kristi Twoey reported she has done some online research and noted a potential cost of \$40,000.
- Paul Kitko reported he has spoken with a vendor and was informed there are concerns related to the crack on the wing and while it is possibly superficial there is the possibility of damage and he was given an informational bid of \$20,000-\$25,000 to for relocation of the statues.
- Father Johnathan noted that while the purchase price of the statue may have been around \$40,000 originally to purchase the same statues today would probably be more than \$100,000.
- Joseph Spewock spoke and noted that if the statues are not moved would we be facing this decision again in 20 years and if so, what would the group want done.
- Father Johnathan agreed we want a long-term solution not a short term fix.
- Virginia Kitko noted if you're going to move it in 20 years anyway move it now to IC Cemetery.
- Rod Kitko noted he agrees with moving it now to IC Cemetery and second choice is to leave at IC Church property.

# Pastoral Council Special Meeting Minutes cont'd

### Monday, July 22, 2024

- Paul Kitko noted he agrees the statue would be in better shape to move now versus 20 years from now and his second choice would be to leave at IC Church property.
- Rob Yebernetsky stated he feels it should be left at IC Church property.
- George Pallo asked when this decision must be made, Father Johnathan noted it's not urgent but while there is an offer potentially being made for the land it would be beneficial to decide one way or another.
- Rusty Christoff asked that a monument company be contacted to come assess the statue and determine the best way to preserve it even if it stays at the IC Church site.
- Paul Kitko agreed and noted a monument company should be contacted to assess the statue and determine preservation and/or potential to move the statue.
- Jenny Leskovansky thanked all in attendance and reported the notes from this meeting will be reviewed at the next Pastoral Council Meeting on Monday, August 5, 2024.

No more questions being noted, the meeting was adjourned at 7:30 pm.
