# Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

#### January is Human Trafficking Prevention Month

Child Sex Trafficking is a form of child abuse that occurs when any child under age 18 is advertised, solicited, or exploited through a commercial sex act where sex is traded for money, food, shelter, drugs, or anything of value. Traffickers can be anyone including friends, gangs, family members, foster parents, perceived trusted adults or boyfriends. Talk to your child openly about this reality and build resiliency. Address the myths and misconceptions that glamorize the commercial sex industry. Social media and gaming platforms are increasingly becoming the tool traffickers and other predators use to target, groom, and recruit victims. At some point your child will likely be confronted with inappropriate messages or see things online that they know are wrong. Teach your child how to handle these situations. Meeting Minutes

January 8, 2024

#### Call to Order

Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by President Kristi Twoey.

#### <u>Prayer</u>

Father Johnathan Schmolt led the Council in prayer.

#### Roll Call

Father Johnathan Schmolt, Krist Twoey-President, Deacon Gene Miller-Ex-officio, Robert Chirdon, Jim Rice, Mary Ann Hockman, Tina Stine, Tim Slifko, Floyd Hauth, Ed Vancas and Jenny Leskovansky

#### Approval of Minutes

Minutes for November 13, 2023, meeting was reviewed, motion to accept minutes made by Tim, second by Robert, vote taken, and minutes approved without opposition.

#### Old Business

- **Stained Glass Windows**: Kristi reported no updates at this time, will report at the next meeting. Robert and Kristi will open and investigate the status of windows and take pictures to report at the next meeting.
- **Pastoral Council Bylaws:** Bylaw amendments were reviewed, motion by Tim, second by Ed, discussion was held regarding Article VII Conduct of Business, after discussion it was determined to maintain current wording in Section I of Article VII Conduct of Business. Vote taken, motion passed unanimously, Bylaws will have final vote at next meeting.
- Religious Education Report: Kristi read the Religious Education report from Cassandra Kitko: The Edge Program for grades 6-8 currently has 20 students and is going well. There are 12 students to receive Confirmation, 2 students to receive First Reconciliation, and 3 students to received First Holy Communion. At the beginning of the catechism year there was a need for a 5<sup>th</sup> grade teacher so grades 4-5 were combined, since then a 5th grade teacher has volunteered, and classes are separated. Safe Environment training was completed this past week. Blessed Chalk will be handed out next week for door blessing. The Confirmation students are working on letters to Bishop Persico. Confirmation will be Tuesday, March 12, 2024. First Reconciliation is Thursday, February 15, 2024, and First Holy Communion is Sunday, May 5, 2024.

#### **Committee Reports**

- Fundraising Committee: Jenny reported next Fundraising meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, January 9 at which time October 21 Club and Turkey Bingo will be reviewed. Paddle Party is scheduled for Saturday, March 2, 2024 and Lottery Calendars will be for sale in early summer.
- Cemetery Committee: Ray Helsel has joined the committee. Robert is still looking for a few more members.
- **Building and Grounds Committee:** Jenny reported CTK Parish Center drains, steamers, and garbage disposal are being evaluated and taken care of, ice machine to be repaired and placed on maintenance schedule. CTK flooring issue is being evaluated to be repaired. IC chimney and flue, garage wall and retaining wall were repaired, dishwasher installed in parish hall, grass repaired in IC lawn after high lift disturbed grass, IC roof flashing to be repaired. Building and grounds committee has moved meetings to 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of month.
- Evangelization Committee: Deacon reported committee had good start, meeting this coming Thursday, Jan 11, will review Saint Nicholas lunch, Deacon noted the lunch went well. About 25 kids attended and got treats and gold coins and there were 3 raffle prizes handed out. Parents provided positive feedback regarding the event. Traveling Chalice program and Stations of the Cross will be discussed at the next meeting for the coming 6 months. Potential evening Exposition of Blessed Sacrament. Discussing Family Movie night, possible parish retreat and game night for kids. RCIA-there is 1 person who will be confirmed and other 2 people are attending that are current parishioners.

#### New Business

• **Property potentially for sale near St. Lawerence:** Discussion was held that the property discussed at previous meeting was not adjacent to St. Lawerence, however it was noted there may be another lot for sale that is adjacent to St. Lawerence, Motion made by Tim, Second by Tina to allow Father to investigate potential sale should property become available.

#### New Business (cont'd):

- Pastoral Council Member Terms: Lots were cast regarding terms for current members, effective July 1, 2024, the following council members will be on council for the term noted:
  - 1-year term-Mary Ann Hockman, Jenny Leskovansky, Ed Vancas
  - ♦ 2-year term-Robert Chirdon, Floyd Hauth, Kristi Twoey
  - ♦ 3-year term-Tim Slifko, Jim Rice Tina Stine
- Parish Money Counters: Father reported there are currently 8 or 9 counters and there is need for 3-4 more. Counting is presently occurring Sunday morning after 10 am mass and lasting approximately 3 hours. There are to be 4 counters per session and the goal will be a rotation of counting one Sunday per month with 4 teams of counters.
- Cemetery Lawn Maintenance Contract: Discussion was held regarding getting bids for Christ the King Church cemeteries and Immaculate Conception Cemeteries, Father will discuss with current vendors and provide bids for summer 2024 in the coming months.
- Cemetery Plot Fees: Item tabled for next meeting.
- CTK Rectory HVAC: Father reviewed HVAC system issues from past summer. Bids were reviewed, discussion was held and motion made by Ed second Floyd, to make recommendation of replacing HVAC system by lower bid vendor to Finance Committee, discussion held, motion passed without opposition.
- CTK Parish Center Floor Cleaning: Father contacted SCI Houtzdale and will submit request for community service project of floor stripping and waxing of CTK Parish Center.
- **CTK Parish Center Rental for Charity Event**: Discussion was held regarding request for HCPA to use Parish Center for charity event. Motion was made to have it as a Charity event, by Robert second by Ed, motion passed with notation of Tim voting in opposition.
- **Pastor's Items**: Father reported we are 30% over budget in donations this month, he is very grateful and excited with the upturn in donations. He further noted more people are being noticed in attendance at masses. Father encouraged Pastoral Council to reach out to new faces or returning faces we see in church.

Next meeting set for Monday, February 5, 2024, at 6:30 pm

<u>Adjournment</u>-Tina made motion, second by Jenny to adjourn meeting, vote taken, motion passed without opposition. Meeting adjourned at 8:25 pm.
